To the new residents of the City of Biloxi:

As many of you may know, the Mississippi Supreme Court recently added a 1.75-mile area to the City of Biloxi in response to requests from Wells Ferry Landing residents to become part of Biloxi.

In general terms, this new part of Biloxi includes those areas north of the Tchoutacabouffa River, from the former Biloxi city limits on Old Highway 67 just east of Cedar Lake Road to include part of Lickskillet Road to McCully on the east. The Supreme Court ruling means that Biloxi now includes such streets as Hickman Road and its connecting thoroughfares, Paradise Lane, Highway 15, and, of course, the Wells Ferry Landing area.

The total area, which became part of Biloxi April 1, includes about 145 residences and a number of businesses.

I'm sure that some of you may have questions about what happens now that you are officially residents of Biloxi. Members of the Biloxi Police and Fire departments are circulating this card to help make you aware of basic contact numbers and city services.

We'll attempt to answer some of the most frequently asked questions in an upcoming mailout, and more information will be passed along to you as soon as it becomes available. You can also find a wealth of information about city programs and projects online at biloxi.ms.us.

In closing, I welcome you as new residents of Biloxi, and I promise that we're going to do everything that we can to make this a smooth transition, and make you proud to live in Biloxi.
