BP Update on Mississippi Coastline Response Activities 7AM - May 13, 2010

BP's CEO Tony Hayward and Managing Director Bob Dudley met with Governor Barbour, Lt. Governor Phil Bryant, DMR Executive Director Dr. Bill Walker and DEQ Executive Director Trudy Fisher and other state officials on Wednesday, May 12 in Biloxi to provide an update and answer questions.

Shoreline protection

An extensive shoreline protection plan continues to be implemented with hard boom and sorbent being deployed along the environmental sensitive areas of the Mississippi coast as identified and prioritized by the DEQ and DMR. To date, about 321,000 ft has been deployed to protect sensitive areas along the Mississippi coast (no oil from the Gulf spill has been reported in state waters so far).

Vessels of Opportunity

BP has held 9 Vessels of Opportunity Safety & Induction training sessions in Mississippi, including one with Vietnamese interpreters on hand.

On **Thursday May 13**, a class will be held: Harrison County MGCCC Fine Arts Auditorium 2226 Switzer Rd. Gulfport, MS

To date 2,123 vessel owners, captains and crew members have participated in the training across Mississippi. About 494 vessel owners in Mississippi have submitted charter agreements and about 247 contracts have been activated. Eligible vessels are being compensated for their assistance.

Participants in the "Vessel of Opportunity" program assist the response by manning boats in a variety of activities, including transporting supplies, assisting with wildlife rescue, as well as towing and deploying absorbent booms. The training covers such areas as oil spill response safety, boom towing and handling, and vessel coordination.

Local Hiring:

Approximately 2,000 people from Mississippi have been hired to date for in-state response to the oil spill incident.

Community Outreach

BP has three Community Outreach Offices open in Mississippi. The offices are open to provide information to the local communities and to respond to questions and concerns as they arise. Each office receives about 100 walk-ins/day seeking information on the response, claims process and the VOO program.

On Wednesday, May 12, BP participated in several meetings with Mississippi stakeholders to provide updates and answer questions, meetings included Mississippi Coast Tourism partners, NAACP, and a town hall sponsored by the Sierra Club and the Steps Coalition in partnership with the city of Ocean Springs.

Claims

Total of 1004 claims have been filed in Mississippi and more than \$552,500 in claims have been paid to date (cob May 12, 2010).

- To file a claim, **first contact the claims** line at 1-800-440-0858. The claims line is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Each claim will be assigned a claims number and an adjuster.
- Adjusters will request documentation (e.g. driver's license, boat registrations, commercial fishing licenses, catch tickets, tax returns) to substantiate a claim.
- Adjustors will review documentation and either submit the claim for payment <u>or</u> assign the individual to a local claims representative.
- Claimants who are assigned to a local claims representative will be scheduled for a visit at one of the Mississippi claims offices.
- Please note that the claims offices can not process claims without a claims number. Claims numbers are only provided via the 1-800 claims line.
