Community & Volunteers

- Daily 11 AM meeting with EOC. Meeting with Emergency Management officials from county, fire depts., police offices, mayors, ESF personnel, DEQ, US Environmental Services, DMR and other local stakeholders
- A meeting was held with Mayor Longo of Waveland and Ms. Lili Stahler, an Alderman
- There was a Public & Community Affairs meeting on funding requests that would assist the local communities. The objective was to pull together information and put some structure and categories around all the events, non-profit /or other special funding requests.
- An interview with WLOX about donations made in Hancock County
- June 14 or 15: Jobbers raising concerns re: boycotts and business implications - Bruce Johnson, GPA, coordinating a tour of preparedness
- Community Outreach team is also working on reaching out to civic organizations such as the Chamber of Commerce, Rotary, etc. to let them know that we are here to address any questions that they might have.

Environmental & Wildlife

- Deploying additional absorbent boom in Hancock Div 1
- Deploying additional absorbent boom in Hancock Div 2. Require an additional 43,000 feet of hard boom for the north side of St. Louis Bay.
- Deploying additional absorbent boom in Hancock Div 4 in the Biloxi Area
- Cleaned up tar balls on Petit Bois.
- Deployed additional absorbent boom at Jackson Div 3 & 4.
- Received a report of oil patches (sheen, tar balls and mouse) 9 to 11 miles south of Petit Bois and Horn Island. TF 5 skimmed during day light hours and will be available along with TF 2 for first light tomorrow. TF 706 in route to the area

Vessels of Opportunity

- 539 vessels deployed for boom surveillance/debris removal
- Additional vessels were engaged in the oil surveillance south of the barrier islands in Mississippi today. (Total of 141)
- Need to resolve the issue of pleasure boats being called into VOO duty ahead of commercial boats
- Concerns that people who make their living on the Gulf are not given priority in the VOO program.
- There is confusion among many activated VOO vessels without 'yellow card' training
- VOO trained workers will: set and tend boom; operate USCG VoSS(skimming system); search and rescue; find tar balls using sonar; safety boats on strike teams; command boats on Strike teams.

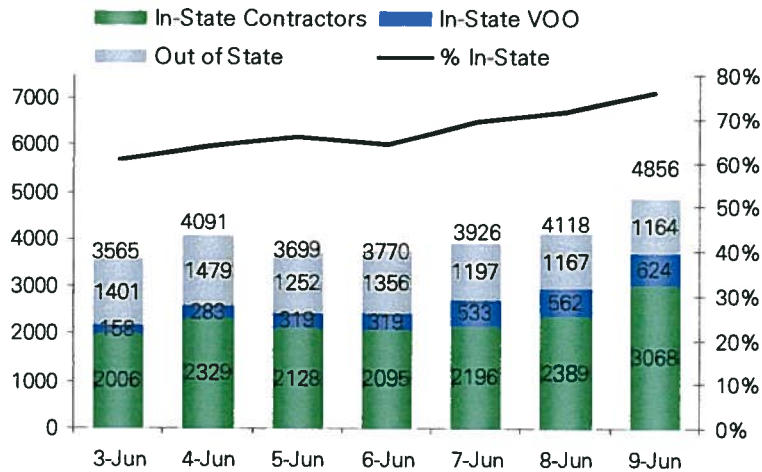
Opportunities

- A process is being put in place to notify individuals who completed the Alternative Technology Response Forms and whose ideas were rejected In addition to focus on local government
Simplify communications so that the city officials are not overwhelmed with meetings and emails
- Local offices need to have contact information for contractors and sub-contractors employed by BP to assure local business and officials these contractors are part of the relief effort
- Communication between the Command Center and local EOC continues to be an issue. Their need is to receive information on what is planned.

Close of June 9, 2010

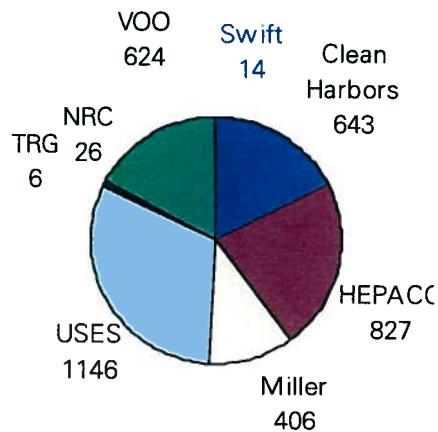
Mississippi Resource Utilisation



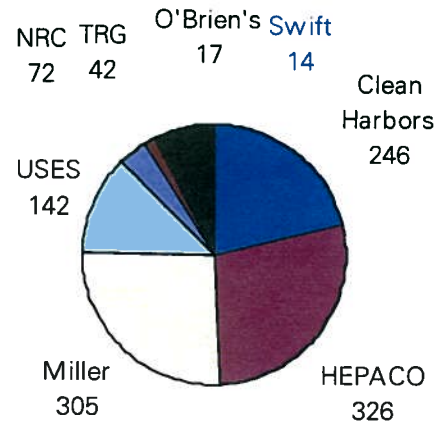
Key Messages

- Will take time, but transition has commenced.

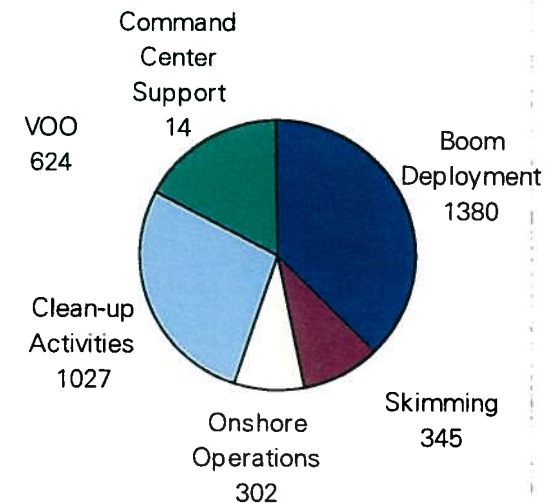
In-State Resources - Contractors (Total 3692)
