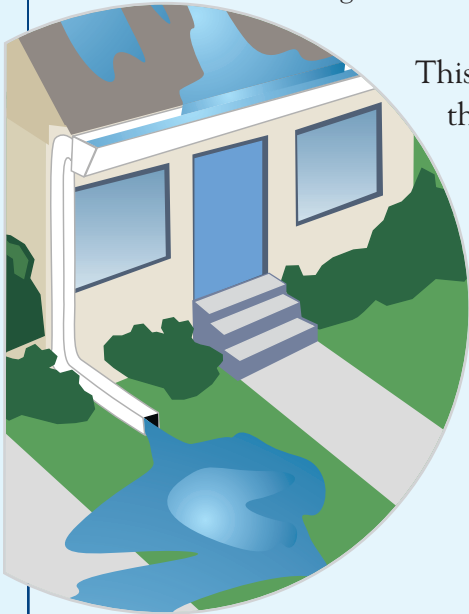
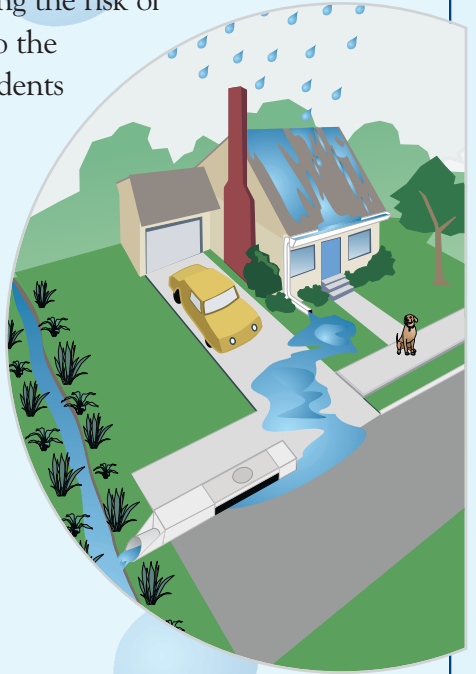


Help protect our waterways and help minimize flooding
