The city's \$355 million Restore Biloxi Infrastructure Repair Program is coming to your area, and we want to help make you aware of potential impacts to your neighborhood.

The construction, valued at over \$11.3 million, will take place primarily in the Cedar Lake subdivision (along Kimbrough Boulevard, Quint Place, Ruth Court and Fenton Drive), Brasher Road (from the north-south section to Wells Road), North Haven Drive, Bayside Drive, Hillside Drive, Edgewood Court, Sunrise Court, Illing Court, Royal Drive, El Camino Drive, Clearview Drive, Mulberry Drive, Marsh Cove, Waters View Drive, Savannah Estates, Michelle Drive, Alden Court, Valerie Drive, Eric Court and Destiny Plantation.

The project will include replacing or rehabbing water mains, sanitary sewer lines and storm drains as well as replacing the streets, curbs and sidewalks impacted by the construction work. Work on some of the existing sanitary sewers and storm drains will not disturb roadways. Some roadways, such as Destiny Plantation, will not have to be disturbed as repairs are made to sanitary sewers and storm drains. As part of this project, seven pump stations will be rehabilitated and one pump station will be completely rebuilt.

The work will begin in early April 2014 and is scheduled to be completed 540 days later, in early September 2015. Some lane closures will be required over the course of the work as well as periodic short-term interruptions to water service. However, we will work to inform you about each of these in advance. You may see heavy equipment using the streets in and near construction zones. Any traffic detours will be clearly marked.

A public meeting to discuss the project, known as NOB2, NOB4, NOB5 and NOB6, will be held Tuesday, March 25 at North Bay Elementary School, Indian Drive, off Popp's Ferry Road. The meeting will begin at 6 p.m. Representatives from the city, program manager HNTB, and contractor Hemphill Construction will be on hand to answer questions you might have.

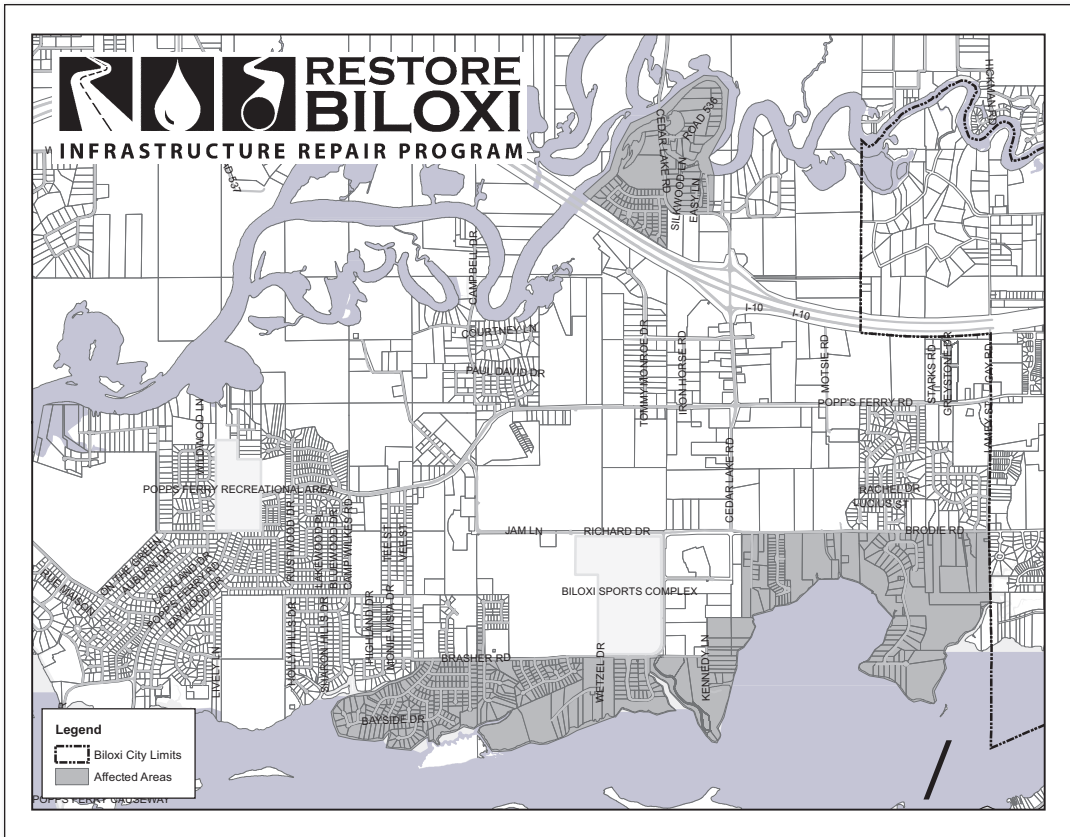
