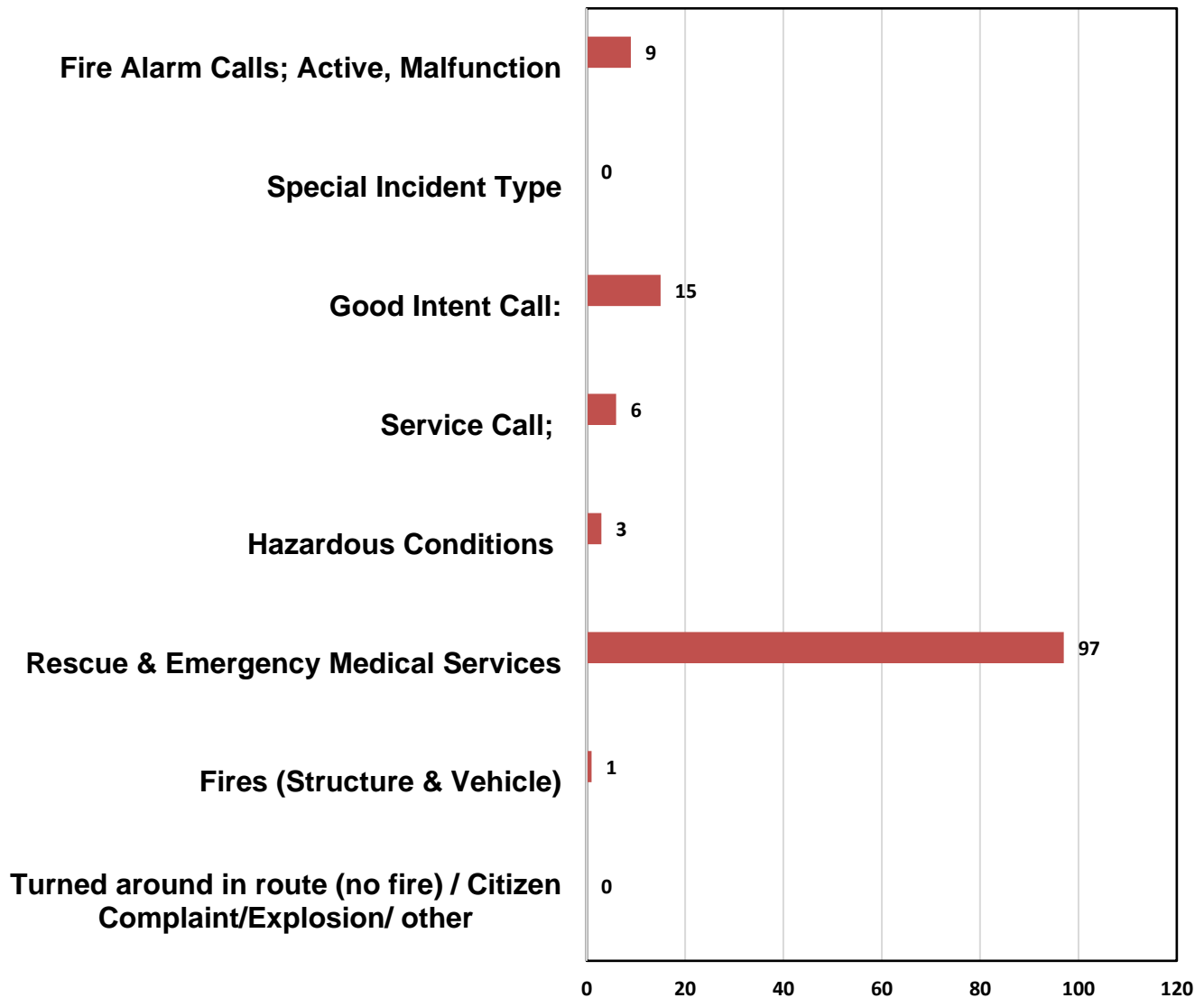

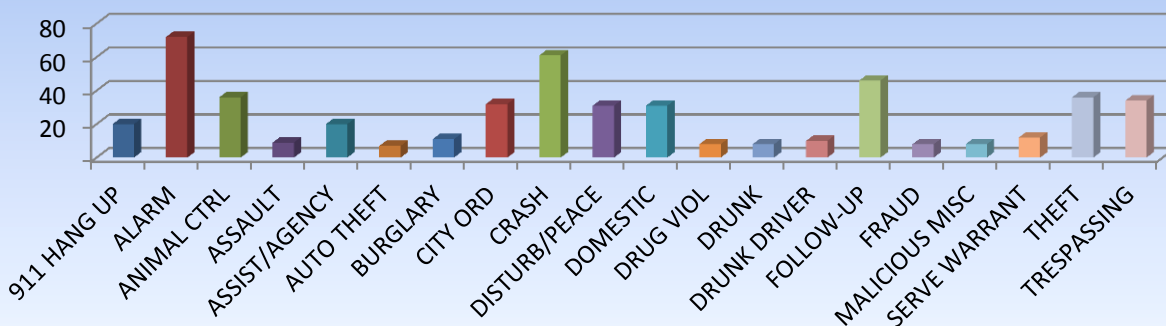

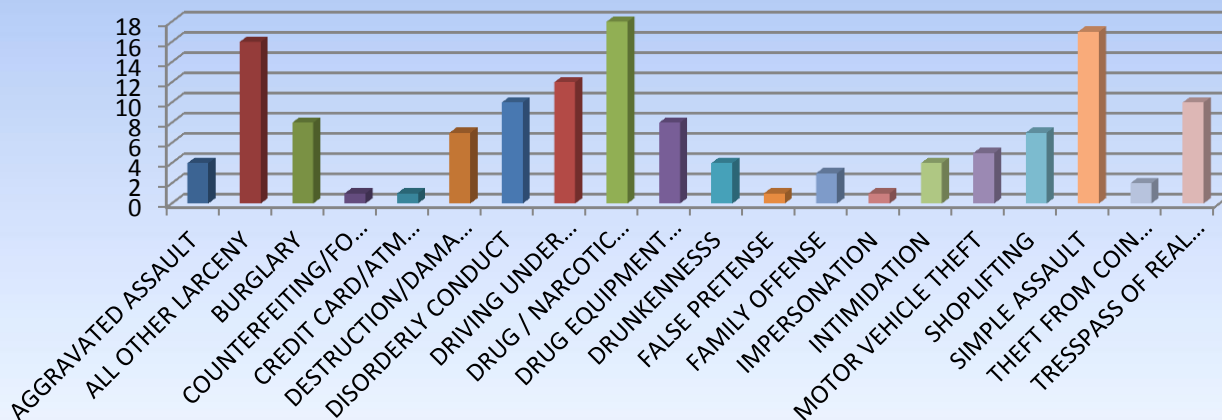

Last week in Community Development, the Planning Commission voted 8-1-1 to approve an application to change the zoning for 626 acres that were recently annexed into the City of Biloxi. The property, included in the application, is owned by Pitcher Point Development, who is proposing to build a Mixed Use Development that will contain a commercial nucleus, with retail centers, restaurants, etc., along with Market Rate, Multi-Family, and Single Family Housing. The Belle La Vie project will also include a Continuing Care Retirement Community. The recommendation of approval of the zoning change will now go before the City Council for final consideration.

An application to remove two protected trees from the site of the proposed Salt Grass Restaurant on Beach Boulevard was reduced to one tree by the applicant. One tree will be removed, and mitigation will be accomplished by providing replacement protected trees. The newly formed Biloxi Tree Committee will determine the location for the replacement trees.

Also last week, there was an announcement concerning the acquisition of the former Wal-Mart structure, which is located on Pass Road. The structure was purchased by a “to be announced” national retailer, who plans to renovate the building and create individual tenant spaces.
