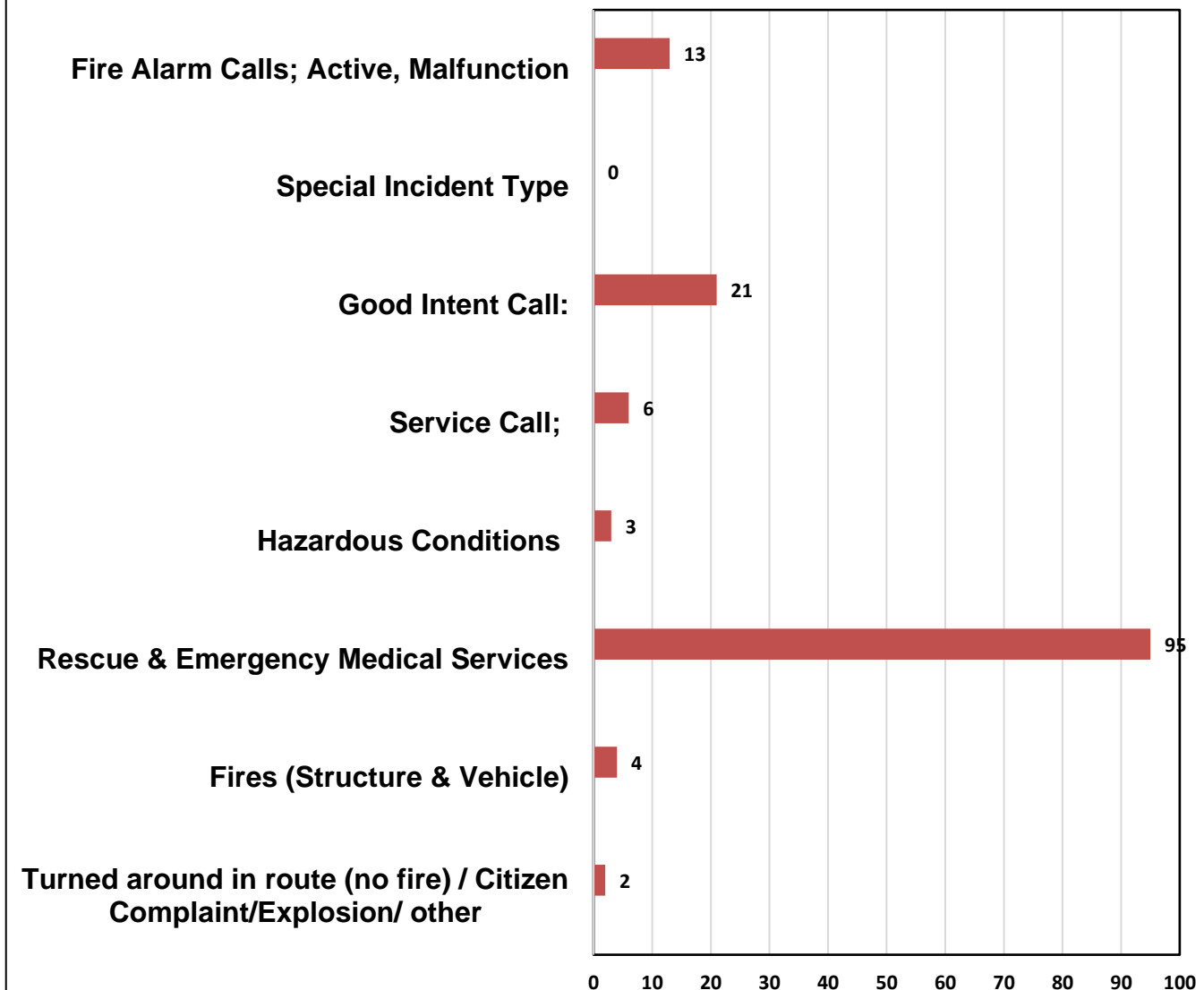

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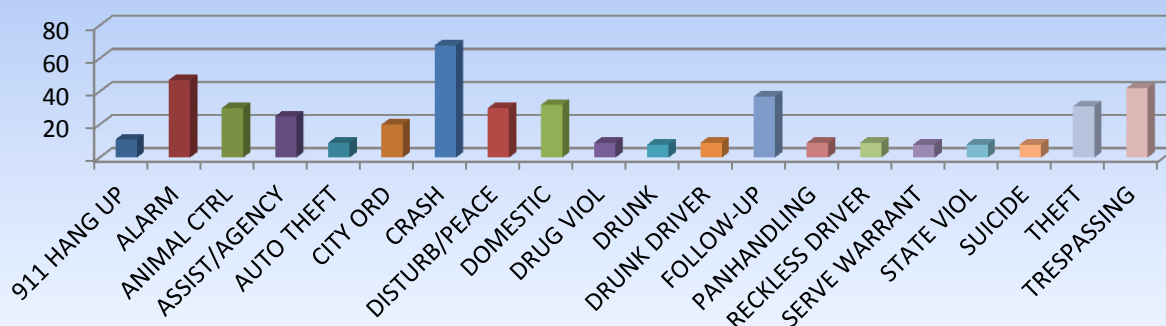

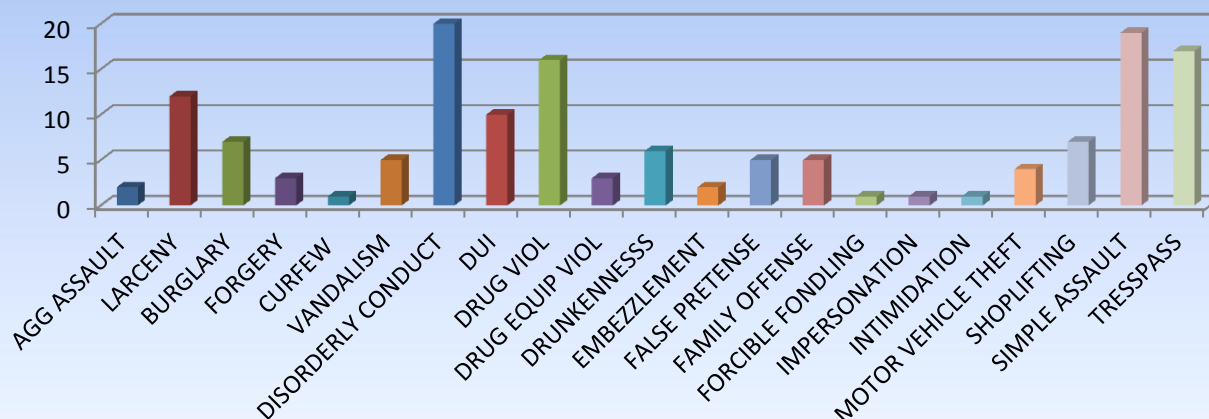

#### Hurricane Nate

- Working on plans/specs for Lighthouse Pier
- Working on plans/specs for Ice Wharf and Oak St. pier repairs
- Completed damage inspection with FEMA on Lighthouse Pier, Street Lights, Lift Stations, Wells, Ice Wharf, Oak St. & Coliseum Pier inspections

#### Projects

- Amtrak rail platform grant – Continuing assisting Southern Rail Commission with grant application
- Bayview Avenue Boardwalk – Met with Seymour Engineering for an update, need conceptual approved
- Canaan Fishing Dock Improvements – Met with Seymour Engineering last week for a status update, setting up meeting with DMR
- **CIPP McDonnell Ave.** – Bid opening postponed until Feb. 5<sup>th</sup>
- Clearview Drainage – remaining work includes dressing up and hydroseeding
- CSX Crossing Closure – NS contract awarded to begin preliminary work; MDOT MOU pending MDOT signature; once City receives executed MOU City can give NS the NTP.
- Dredging – Finished Canaan, Point Cadet finishing up; Borries going to go to Oak Street to remove debris there. DMR is going to make us apply for a permit for Oak Street debris removal

- East Biloxi Public Access & Living Shoreline – Have amendments for Task A, B, & F ready for approval; have preliminary layouts for Task D & E these are now ready for permitting.
- East Biloxi Boardwalk (Small Craft to Kuhn St.) – BMA performing structural analysis
- Ellzey Place II – road base currently being installed
- Ellzey Place III – design contract awarded, survey complete, working on horizontal layout and tying into retirement home
- Emerald Lake Subdivision Phase II (Hudson Krohn Rd.) – complete, contractor finishing punchlist items
- Excursion Pier – final panel to be poured in place, then pier will be complete
- **Fire Station No. 7** – SMPDD negotiating with contractor
- Fire Station No. 10 – 30% complete, FD has the initial floor plan for approval
- Howard Avenue –Bids open February 14<sup>th</sup>
- Lighthouse Parking Lot - Bollards, paving & striping are only remaining work
- Jordan Subdivision (Old Hwy 67) – Utility installation complete; waiting for road base to set
- Kayleigh Cove Sewer – 75% of sidewalk complete
- Keesler Gate Outside – ready to begin parcel acquisition
- Keesler Gate Inside – design work approximately 100% complete; bidding still on schedule for January 2018; acquisition & relocation started
- Keesler Privatization – submitted 2<sup>nd</sup> round responses; expect final decision Oct – Dec 2018
- Popp's Ferry Extension – preparing maps & deeds for property acquisition; talking to Coliseum about contributing funds for project
- Pedestrian Crosswalk @ MGM – Construction expected to start Feb. 2018 and complete by Dec. 2018
- Pedestrian Crosswalk @ Harbor – Survey complete; geotech samples complete; waiting for geotech report

- Point to Palace Boardwalk – working on initial layout
- **Police Substation Interior** – on hold
- Public Safety Center Roof Leaks – Dale proposals on Council this week
- Popp's Ferry Bridge Submarine Cable – Bids being tabulated by DE, apparent lowest bidder KR Borries at \$1.1M
- Popp's Ferry Bridge & Approaches – pending EA approval
- Popp's Ferry Causeway – construction continuing; adding the following work – sidewalk to Cambridge Drive, additional solar lights, fishing cleaning stations, bait tanks at bait shop, kayak racks at bait shop, additional educational signs and components, upgrade walking trail materials to flexipave; trying to fit in additional parking but looking like there's not enough room; any work at the boat ramp was denied because it wasn't in original scope and there are not permits covering that area
- Post Office Build-out – Finalizing HVAC, then project will be ready to bid
- Rock Creek Subdivision Phase III – contractor finishing punchlist, working toward final plat approval; contractor working on re-grading some of the properties along Sage Road to drain toward street instead of toward existing homes in rear
- Saenger Theater – Exterior repair design underway
- **Small Craft Boat Launch** – Work is complete, launch is now open
- Smith Subdivision – Saunders Const. has done clearing & grubbing but no other work; no start date at this time
- Snyder Center Roof – Contract on Council agenda
- Tremont Drive repairs – Contractor has started work
- **West Biloxi Boardwalk** - NTP date Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup>; completion date July 2018
- Woolmarket Master Plan – Received final draft for review;
- Woolmarket Rd. East Drainage – met with Corps of Engineers and DMR; going to have to minimize impact to wetlands
- **Woolmarket Rd. East (Larkin) water line** – Received bids, DNA Underground apparent low, bid reviews underway
