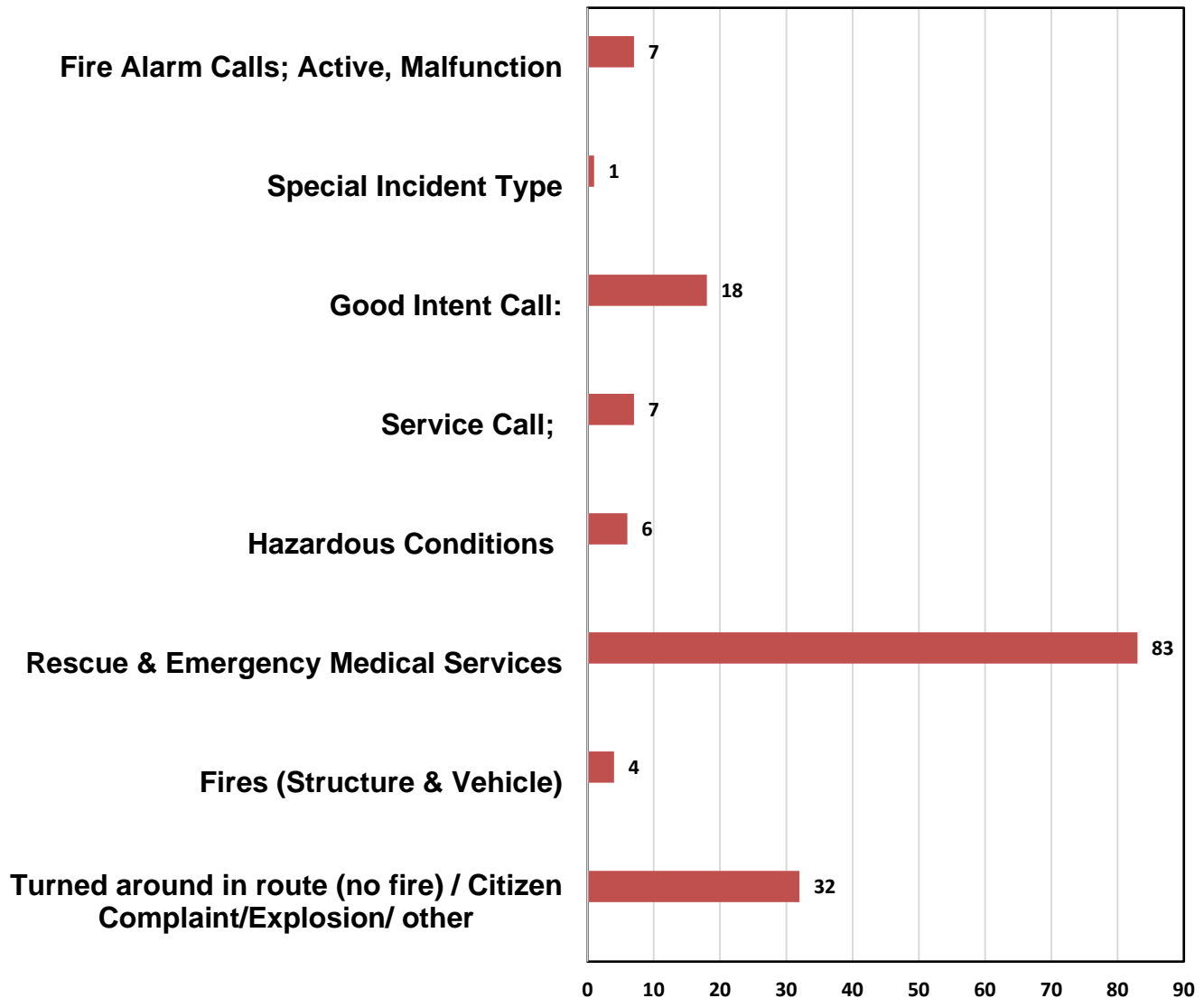

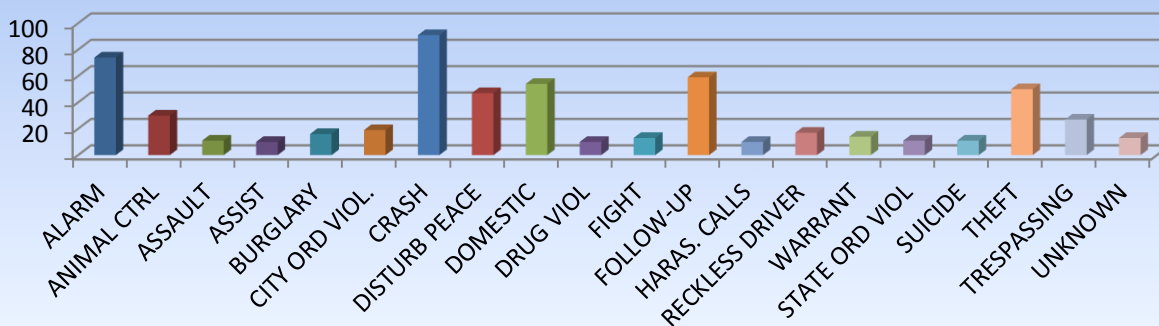

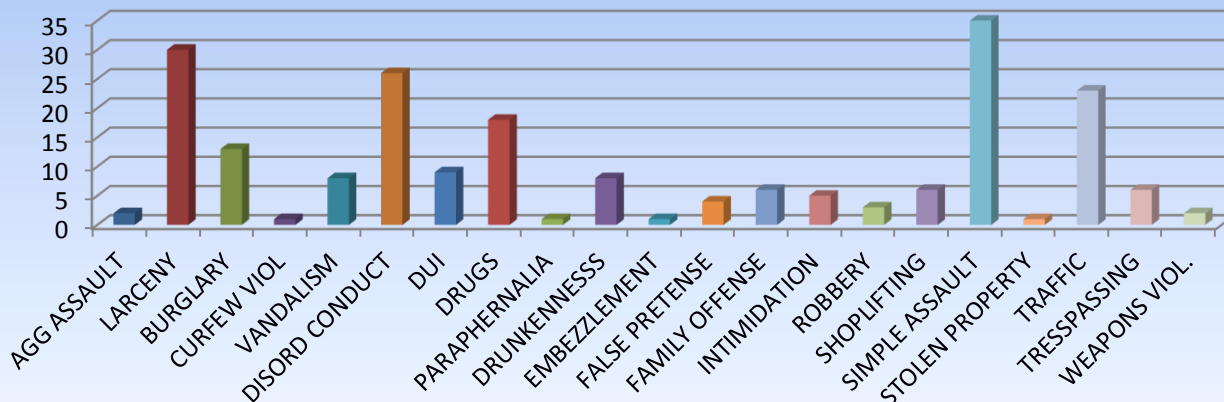

Last week in Community Development, the Planning Commission voted 8-4 to approve an application for the proposed Biloxi Bay RV Resort to be located on 14.5 acres on Wells Drive. In addition to the RV sites and cabins, the park will include two swimming pools, a splash pad, and a goofy golf course. The Planning Commission recommendation will now go before the City Council for final consideration.

Also last week, applications were submitted for DRC, and AHRC, by representatives of the Blind Tiger Restaurant to restore the former Oak Street Pier, for boat and pedestrian access. The DRC case will be heard this Wednesday, and the AHRC case will be held on June 8.

Site work began last week for the new Hilton Garden Inn, to be constructed at the northeast corner of Beach Boulevard and Dukate Street. Construction of the 100 room hotel is expected to take 12-14 months.

Sales Tax Revenues for April 2017 increased \$120,212 over the same month last year. We are currently up \$397,341 over the same four month period from last year.
