


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

Community Development Update 5/9/2016

Last week in Community Development, the Zoning Board of Adjustments and Appeals, held a public hearing to consider applications for variances for the proposed La Quinta Hotel. The requests are for variances to the front and side yard setback requirements, and a variance request concerning the landscape buffer requirement. Public comments were taken, and the board continued the case until the next meeting, which will be held on May 19. The Planning Commission approved the street vacation for the western end of McElroy Street in the downtown area. The recommendation for approval will now go before the City Council for final consideration.

Also last week, the Development Review Committee approved a site plan for a new warehouse for Southern Supply Company on Howard Avenue, and considered revisions to the site plan for the proposed Blind Tiger Restaurant.

The Building Department issued 61 building permits with a construction valuation of \$1.3 million dollars. Certificates of Occupancy were issued for 5 structures, and licenses were issued for 2 new businesses. Inspectors performed 83 building inspections, and code enforcement officers opened 137 cases and resolved 254.
