### PROJECT SUMMARY

### 10. Provide Brief Project Description/Overview:

This Tidelands project involves construction of a boardwalk that borders the seawall from Rodenberg Avenue to just past Camellia Street; construction of a boat ramp at the south end of Camellia; interval parking; and provision of covered pavilions, kiosks, and benches along the boardwalk. Low impact signage will identify shore birds, native plants and other natural resources of the project area.

Design of this project will be consistent with the other public improvements that form Biloxi's chain of waterfront amenities, preserving authentic Biloxi styles, standards and materials. Ultimately, the waterfront boardwalk will extend west to DeBuys Road, connecting Point Cadet with the Schooner Pier Complex, Tricentennial Park, the Biloxi Small Craft Harbor, Lighthouse Park, West Biloxi Festival Boardwalk Area and the Sand Beach to the City Limits.

### 11. LIST Project Goals/Objectives:

The goal is to provide a public, multi-use waterfront destination that will support beach festivals and other events and will expand the customer base of area businesses.

The objectives to accomplish this goal are:

- construct environmentally-sensitive public amenities along the seawall to improve pedestrian access to the beach and shoreline south of existing businesses;
- construct public parking areas at intervals to support access to the boardwalk;
- construct compatibly-designed covered pavilions, benches, kiosks and discreet educational signage.

#### 12. LIST Project Benefits:

Project benefits include:

- improved public access to a tidelands affected area that is sheltered from view on the south side of Highway 90;
- expanded recreational opportunities for residents and visitors in a tidelands affected area that previously had limited access;
- alleviated congestion at area boat ramps through construction of a new ramp at Camellia Street
- increased economic activity for area businesses;
- expanded educational opportunities through low-impact signage

The portion of Harrison County Sand Beach in Biloxi located between Rodenberg Avenue and Camellia Street is noteworthy because much of it is separated from Highway 90 by a swath of land upon which is built tourist-oriented establishments that form a buffer between the shore and the highway. While this section of beach is especially beautiful, the buffer formed by businesses and condominiums makes access to the beach less visible and less inviting to passers-by.

The project aims to increase public access to this portion of the beach through construction of a boardwalk with linking walkways to adjacent businesses and to new public parking areas located at intervals with appropriate signage. Construction of a boat ramp at Camellia Street will provide access to the Mississippi Sound for the boating and fishing public.

The boardwalk will border the edge of the sand beach along the seawall, south of existing commercial development. It will provide a pedestrian venue to facilitate access to the beach and it will be a destination in itself that will draw people to the area and increase business. It also will be a setting for festivals and other outdoor community activities.

Two pavilions will be constructed along the boardwalk, one east of Veterans Avenue and one near the Camellia Street boat ramp. These will support field trips, festivals and general recreation. The boardwalk will have intermittent shaded areas, benches and kiosks. Small signage will explain beach ecology in the area, including identification of native plants and shoreline birds.

Design of this project will be consistent with the other public improvements that form Biloxi's chain of waterfront amenities, preserving authentic Biloxi styles, standards and materials. Ultimately, the waterfront boardwalk will extend west to DeBuys Road, connecting Point Cadet with the Schooner Pier Complex, Tricentennial Park, the Biloxi Small Craft Harbor, Lighthouse Park, West Biloxi Festival Boardwalk Area and the Sand Beach to the City Limits.
