





Community Development Update 6/6/16

Last week in Community Development, the Development Review Committee approved the site plan for the expansion of Campers World, located at the south east corner of I-10 and Shriner's Boulevard. The estimated \$10 Million dollar project will include a new 40,000 sq. ft. RV Center Building, containing a new showroom, office spaces and a complete shop for RV maintenance and repairs. The new site plan has also been revised to relocate the main entrance drive to Shriner's Boulevard to improve visibility and provide easier RV access.

Also last week, the building department issued permits for the Big Play Family Fun Center Bowling Alley and Arcade, the New Athletic Building at Biloxi High School, and one new single family house. A total of 65 building permits were issued last week with a construction valuation of \$1.8 million dollars, and 6 certificates of occupancy. Building inspectors performed 113 Inspections, and code enforcement officers opened 117 cases and resolved 266.
