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PROJECT SUMMARY

? 10. Provide Brief Project Description/Overview:

In 2001, the City of Biloxi established Tricentennial Park on an eight-acre City-owned tract of land located north of Highway 90 in East Biloxi to create a contiguous park-like setting for the future Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art (OOMA), the historic Tullis-Toledano Manor and a proposed Schooner Pier Complex to be located south of the highway. The park's purposes were to expand access to publicly-owned property and to develop it as a multi-use educational and recreational resource showcasing the history and cultural heritage of Biloxi. With Katrina's destruction of Tullis-Toledano Manor, the City is working with OOMA to re-purpose the former site of the manor into a public space that preserves the viewshed and magnificent live oak trees while providing an open area for the public to enjoy nature, family activities and educational resources. Pedestrian access will be provided to reconnect the once-tidally-influenced park to the waterfront with a pedestrian walkover across Highway 90. Public access to the park will be expanded by installation of a wide sidewalk along the north side of the service drive from Oak Street to the Museum. Native plant species will be installed and signage will interpret the site's historical, cultural and archaeological significance and improve knowledge about preserving and restoring wetlands and tidelands affected areas.

? 11. LIST Project Goals/Objectives:

There are three project goals:

- 1) expand public access to Tricentennial Park;
- 2) expand public educational opportunities and recreational uses at the park; and
- 3) re-establish landscaping with native plants appropriate to the site.

The following objectives will be accomplished to achieve the three goals:

- 1) construct an elevated pedestrian walkover across Highway 90 and a wide sidewalk on the north side of the service road;
- 2) install walkways, lighting and irrigation in park; re-establish native plants;
- 3) develop educational material about the site's historical, cultural and archaeological significance and about preserving and restoring wetlands and tidelands affected areas. Educational information will be presented in a variety of ways including interpretive kiosks with signage, photographs and art, native plant identification and special exhibits/displays.

Benefits are:

- expanded access to a once-tidally-affected area and reconnection of the site to the waterfront
- expanded public educational opportunities;
- enhancement of public park and recreational space that is easily accessed from Highway 90;
- preservation of the Mississippi Sound and Deer Island viewshed; and
- economic development in East Biloxi stimulated by Tricentennial Park improvements and programmed activities.

Year 2: Complete pedestrian walkover, sidewalk, walkways and lighting installation; complete foundation identification of Tullis-Toledano Manor buildings and tiled floor preservation; construct educational gazebos; finalize educational and interpretive material and order signage

Year 3: Install native plant landscaping throughout the park; install educational and interpretive material.

The project meets the goals and objectives of the State of Mississippi by enhancing and conserving an eight-acre site that once was tidally-influenced. The project will improve public access and restore a portion of it as a wetlands garden environment. The educational component of the project will inform the public about the value of protecting and conserving tidally affected areas.

Tricentennial Park, located on the north side of Highway 90 in East Biloxi, was purchased to preserve public access to valuable waterfront property that boasted the restored, historic Tullis-Toledano Manor and some of Biloxi's finest old live oak trees. Damage from Hurricane Katrina in 2005 destroyed the Manor and its outbuildings, but many of the oaks survived and the site continues to serve a public purpose by preserving unobstructed views of the Mississippi Sound. Through this project, the City seeks to improve the eight-acre site to complement activities of the Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art (located on the west side of the site); to reconnect the once tidally-influenced park area with the waterfront through safe pedestrian access across Highway 90; and to enhance opportunities for family and recreational activities under the branches of the Live Oaks.

Pedestrian access will be provided to reconnect the park to the waterfront with a pedestrian walkover across Highway 90. A wide sidewalk will be installed on the north side of the service road from Oak Street to the Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art. Other project improvements include lighting, irrigation and pervious paver walkways, educational signage, and passive park amenities such as benches. Throughout the site, native plant landscaping will be installed and discreet signage will identify plants historic uses. Interpretive signage will identify the benefits of restoring and/or preserving wetlands and tidelands affected areas and will showcase the site's historical, cultural and archaeological significance through photographs, timelines and art.

Design of this project will be consistent with the other public improvements that form Biloxi's chain of amenities along the Highway 90 waterfront, from Point Cadet to DeBuys Road, featuring authentic design details, standards and materials. Tricentennial Park will become a prominent link in that chain, enhanced by the presence of the Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art.

The project meets the requirements of the Public Trust Tidelands Act in several areas: by preserving natural scenic qualities in the coastal area and public education of the same; by favoring the preservation of the coastal wetlands and ecosystems; and by conserving the air and waters of the state, and protecting, maintaining, and improving their quality for public use including recreational and other beneficial uses.

Benefits derived from implementation of this Tidelands Trust Fund Project include, but are not limited to, improved public access to a public park with magnificent views of the Mississippi Sound and Deer Island; expanded public recreational park space for picnics and other leisure activities; signage to educate the public about the value of the Coast's natural resources and habitats as well as the site's significance. In addition, increased visitation to this site as a result of project implementation is anticipated to have regional economic benefits, such as job creation and increased sales tax collections, by stimulating redevelopment in East Biloxi.
