ORDINANCE 1398
ORDINANCE TO AMEND §13A-2-2 OF THE BILOXI CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ADD A HOLIDAY COMMEMORATING THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF CERTAIN GREAT AMERICANS TO OUR COUNTRY

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2-84, the City of Biloxi recognized the contribution of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in urging us to seek justice rather than revenge, and to refrain from resorting to acts of violence to implement social changes, by designating January 15, 1984, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. week; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Biloxi would like to continue to honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as well as other great Americans who have made important contributions to the birth, growth, and evolution of this country by creating a permanent holiday in their honor, with additions to the list of Americans so honored to be added by Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINEDED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BILOXI, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. That Section 13A-2-2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Biloxi, Mississippi, 1959, be and hereby is amended as follows:

December 31, 1985

Section 13A-2-2. Holidays.

The following and such other days as the city council may fix, are designated as legal holidays for all employees, except emergency employees (fire, police, etc.) of the city:

The first day of January (New Year's Day)

Great Americans Day (third Monday of every January)

Mardi Gras Day

Good Friday

Memorial Day

The fourth day of July (Independence Day)

The first Monday in September (Labor Day)

Veteran's Day

Thanksgiving Day

The Friday after Thanksgiving Day

The 23rd day of December (½ day for annual municipal employees' Christmas party)

The 24th day of December (Christmas Eve)

The 25th day of December (Christmas Day)

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall be effective from and after its publication in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi
