



The City of Biloxi is collaborating with other entities in Mississippi that receive funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to prepare an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (A.I.). The purpose of this five-year document is to document what efforts are being taken to affirmatively further fair housing in Mississippi. When it is determined that a citizen's rights under the Fair Housing Act are obstructed, a local government and/or housing authority must identify in the A.I. what steps will be taken to address the problem.

As the first step in developing the statewide A.I., the City of Biloxi is asking its residents to complete a short survey as part of the process to identify local fair housing challenges. Information from the survey will be compiled and analyzed to define local, regional and statewide concerns and problems with accessing fair housing. Completed surveys must be turned in as soon as possible or no later than November 2, 2018 at the following locations in order to be considered.
