Re: 2023-TR 003 – Anderson Construction Self Storage (Cedar Lake and Old Hwy 67)

A new self storage facility is proposed for the property at Cedar Lake and Old Hwy 67 for MGCCC. The project proposes the removal of 6 protected trees and one 48" cluster of protected trees, as shown in the SUMMARY OF PROPOSED REMOVALS below:

TREE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Tree Committee has met on-site to view the proposed removals, and hereby makes the following recommendations:

- 1. Recommend accepting the proposed removals.
- 2. Mitigate as per the LDO at a replacement ratio of 2:1. Mitigation may take place by the Developer, or the Developer may pay into the Mitigation Trust. In either scenario, the <u>Tree Committee Recommends the Mitigation Trees be planted on location as follows in order to replenish the canopy at this location:</u>
 - The Landscape Plan (not provided by the Developer at this time) must include the
 mitigation trees at the entrance to the storage facility and along Cedar Lake and Old Hwy
 67 roadways as follows:
 - o 2 Live Oaks
 - o 10 Magnolia
 - 2 Other native large-tree species as listed in the attached City of Biloxi approved Mitigation Tree List. Developer should consult with City Arborist on selection of native large tree species.
- 3. The applicant <u>must correct their site and landscape plans</u> to include:
 - a) Tree protection plans for any protected trees that will remain, according to the LDO, and
 - b) Mitigation Plan
