

City of Biloxi – Mayor's Youth Council Membership Criteria and Application Packet Deadline for Applying: Noon, Aug. 14, 2025

Application for potential membership in the Mayor's Youth Council is open to any student in 11th grade who attends high school and resides within the geographic city limits of the City of Biloxi. Applicants must be current high school students in 11th grade and live in the City of Biloxi. Applicants should be students who are recognized as leaders by their peers, hold leadership positions in the school, are active in the community, and strive for academic excellence.

Purpose of the Mayor's Youth Council

<u>Mission Statement:</u> To give Biloxi youth the opportunity to provide input and insight on community issues, learn about municipal government, and network with youth councils across the state. Through this mission, participants will have the opportunity to develop leadership and citizenship skills for future endeavors.

<u>Vision Statement:</u> The Mayor's Youth Council was created to ensure that the youth of Biloxi are engaged, educated, and connected to city government and the community.

The Mayor's Youth Council provides an outlet for young leaders to discuss and take action to address issues that are important to Biloxi's youth. Members of the Mayor's Youth Council have numerous opportunities to develop their leadership skills through community service by acting as a catalyst for youth engagement in community matters.

The application must be complete to be accepted to proceed to the selection process. A completed application includes all blanks filled in, all signatures, and a letter from the student. If the application is incomplete, it will not be accepted. Upon selection to the program, which is limited to up to 25 students, the selected participants will be required to attend a mandatory orientation on the evening of **Tuesday**, **Sept. 2**, **2025**, **from 3:45-7 p.m.** at Biloxi City Hall, 140 Lameuse St.

Purpose: To educate Biloxi's young adults about city operations and engage them with community issues and challenges that Biloxi's citizens and community leaders face.

Eligibility: You must be in grade 11 and **reside in the City of Biloxi.** To ensure you live in the City of Biloxi, there will be a residency verification.

Expectations: You must attend Youth Council meetings. As a member, you are encouraged to participate in community events and city programs/events, organize and conduct a project, study, or evaluations, and attend City Council meetings. You must provide your own transportation.

You must distribute the Program Calendar to your band director, show choir director, club leaders, cheer and sport coaches, JRROTC, supervisors of extracurricular activities, and clubs, etc.

Attendance: Students must attend every session. If a student is to miss a session for an illness, **prior to the meeting**, parents must notify Susan Hunt by calling 228-297-6808 that the student is ill and cannot attend. If the student must miss a session because of a conflict with a scheduled athletic or academic event, the principal, counselor, athletic director, or academic sponsor <u>must</u> contact Susan Hunt by calling 228-297-6808 **prior to the meeting**, informing Susan Hunt of the situation. Tardiness or early departure will not be tolerated. No more than two absences will be allowed.

Meetings: You will meet approximately 10-12 times during the school year in a city facility or museum from 3:45 to 6:15 p.m. Meeting days will be Mondays or Tuesdays.
