

Ordinance No. 2605

ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2-14-3(B)(8)(F) AND
SECTION 2-14-3(B)(8)(H) PERTAINING TO MUNICIPAL FACILITIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 706-25, the City of Biloxi (the "City") dedicated the Point Cadet Pavilion to George W. Lawrence;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 324-26, the City entered Professional Services Agreement for Market Manager with Bonny Pesch, effectively rendering the Charles R. Hegwood Community Market unavailable for rent by the City;

WHEREAS, Chapter 2, Article 14, Section 3. Municipal Facilities Available for Rental of the Code of Ordinances, Biloxi. Mississippi, of 1992 should be amended to reflect the above-referenced changes; and

WHEREAS, the Biloxi City Council finds that it is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Biloxi that Chapter 2, Article 14, Section 3. Municipal Facilities Available for Rental of the Code of Ordinances, Biloxi. Mississippi, of 1992, be amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BILOXI, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION ONE: Section 2-14-3(b)(8)(f) and Section 2-14-3(b)(8)(h) Municipal Facilities of the Code of Ordinances, Biloxi. Mississippi, of 1992, are hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-14-3. Municipal facilities available for rental.

(b) Rental of city park spaces and outdoor venues.

(8) Rental fees shall be assessed on the following schedule:

f. HowHop Corridor (located under I-110).

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(i) ~~Monthly vendor rental: \$50.00.~~

(ii) ~~Yearly vendor rental: \$150.00.~~

SECTION TWO: Upon unanimous vote of the members of the City Council, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, because it serves the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of Biloxi, and good cause exists for same. If not a unanimous vote this Ordinance shall become effective as soon thereafter as is signed, certified, and as is otherwise provided by law.
